- II. Let's take a little trip to Rome! Turn to p. 204 in your textbook. You will find a map of the Roman forum. Take a couple of minutes to orient yourself with the textbook map. Below are a few highlights of the Roman Forum that are closely pertinent to Cicero.





Rostra (then and now) - #7 on the map. Otherwise known as the orator's platform. Here is where Cicero's head and hands were displayed after he was killed. The display of Cicero's head and hands at the rostra is a bit ironic knowing that Cicero was a rhetorician...

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Cūria Julia – # 11. The Roman senate house erected by Julius Caesar in 44 BC, hence the name *Julia*. Although the fresco *Cicerone Denuncia Catilina* seems to be depicted in the senate house, Cicero gave the first Catilinarian oration at the Temple of Jupiter Stator.



Via Sacra – on the right of #26. It goes from the top of the Capitoline Hill all the way to the Colosseum; named the Via Sacra because it trails along some of the most important religious sites in Rome, e.g. the Temple of Vesta, the Temple of Caesar, the Temple of Saturn. In this photo to the right towards the back you can see the *cūria*.



Templum Jovis Statōris - #27. Note that your textbook says that its identity or location is not definitive. Nonetheless, this temple was used only when great danger was imminent. This is the place where Cicero denounced Catiline in the first Catilinarian.

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Temple of Vesta - #21. Vesta was the goddess of the hearth. Those who were elected to be priestesses of Vesta had the duty of making sure the sacred flame of Vesta did not go out, for as long as the flame burned, the city of Rome was believed to be kept safe.
