I want something to put on."

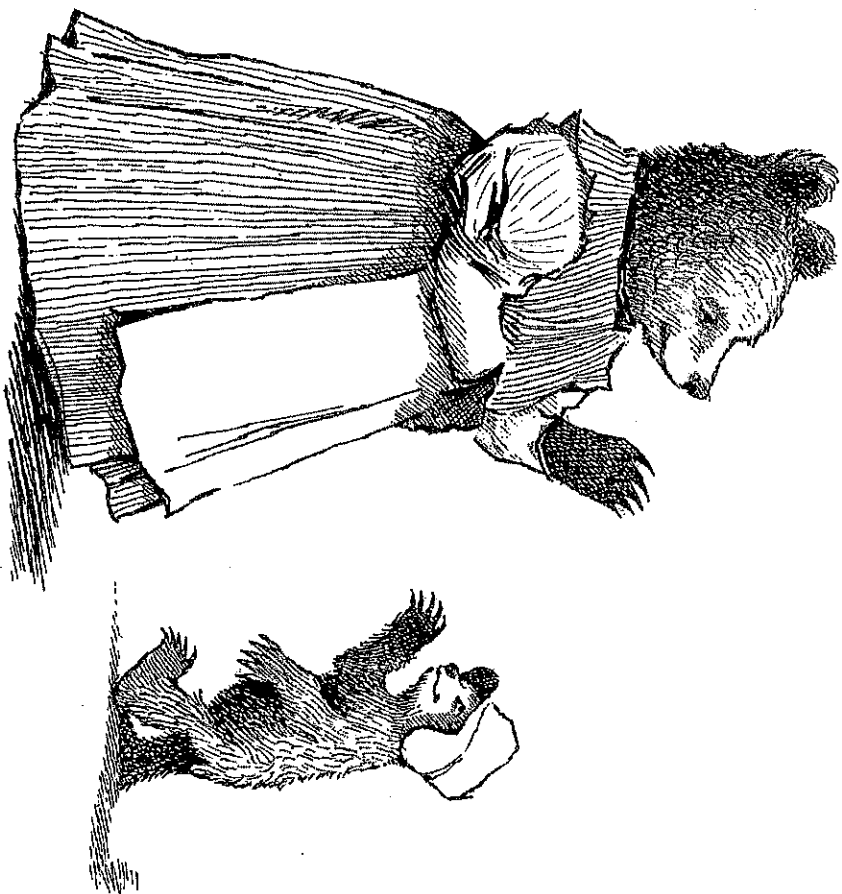


So Mother Bear made something

What A Plant Needs To Grow!

Plants need very few things to survive. All they need is soil, water, air, and sunlight. Sometimes, a little extra love helps too!

Soil helps the roots of a plant hold on to the ground, as it grows bigger and bigger. Without soil, a large plant would just fall over! **Soil** also gives the plant water and nutrients, which help the plant stay nice and healthy.

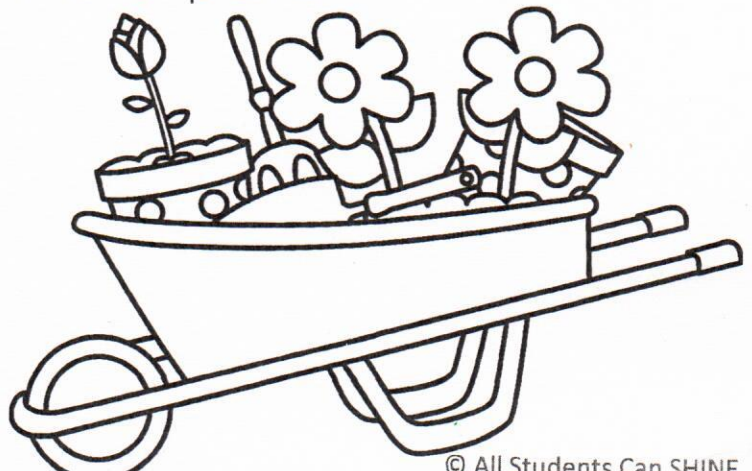
Water helps plants stay hydrated. It also helps the plant move nutrients from the soil to its stem and leaves. Without water, a plant would not be able to carry its food all the way up to the leaves!

Sunlight helps plants by giving them energy. Plants use the sun's energy to make their own energy in their leaves.

Too little sun can cause a plant to stop growing. Too much sun can cause a plant to dry up! Plants need just the perfect amount of sunlight and water to grow!

Plants need **air** to breathe, just like you and me! Plants take in carbon dioxide when they breathe in. They push out oxygen when they breathe out. Oxygen is the part of air that is good for us. Plants take good care of us, when we take good care of them!

Some plants need extra food, called **fertilizer**. This helps plants stay healthy and strong. Fertilizer is vitamins for plants!

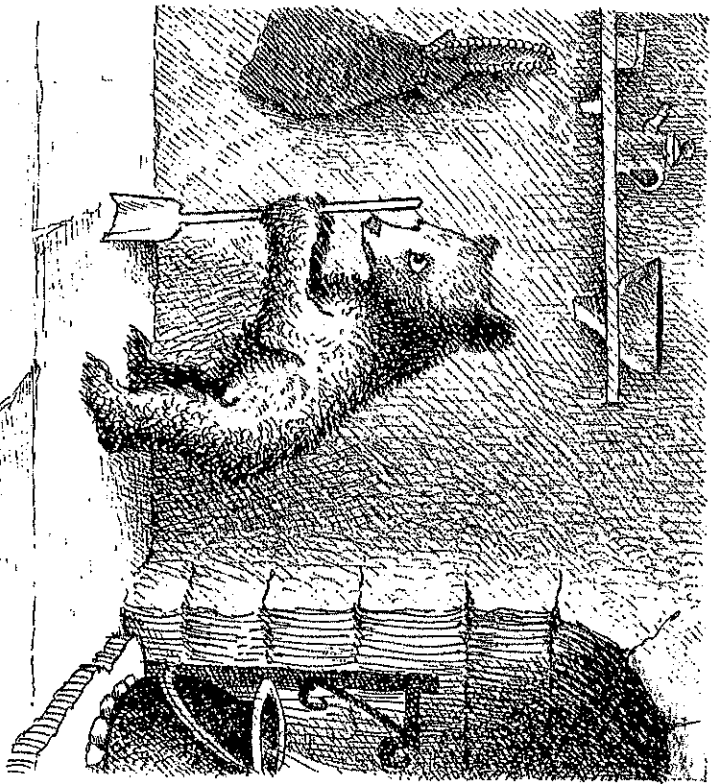

peas and tomatoes;

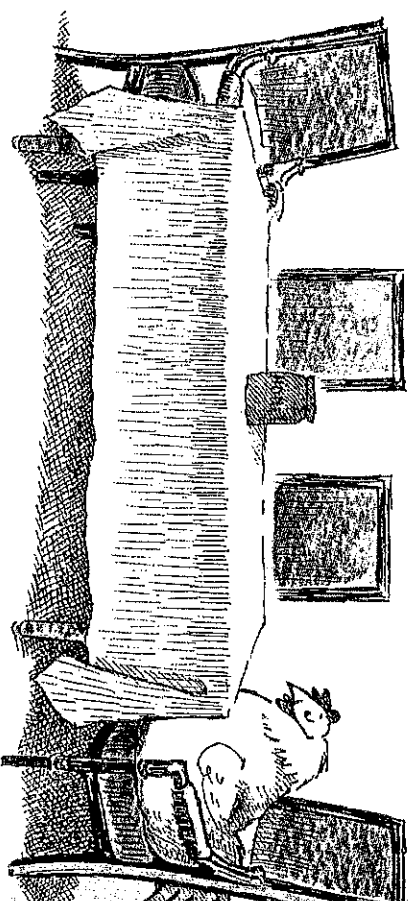
I can make soup with

carrots, potatoes, peas and tomatoes.”

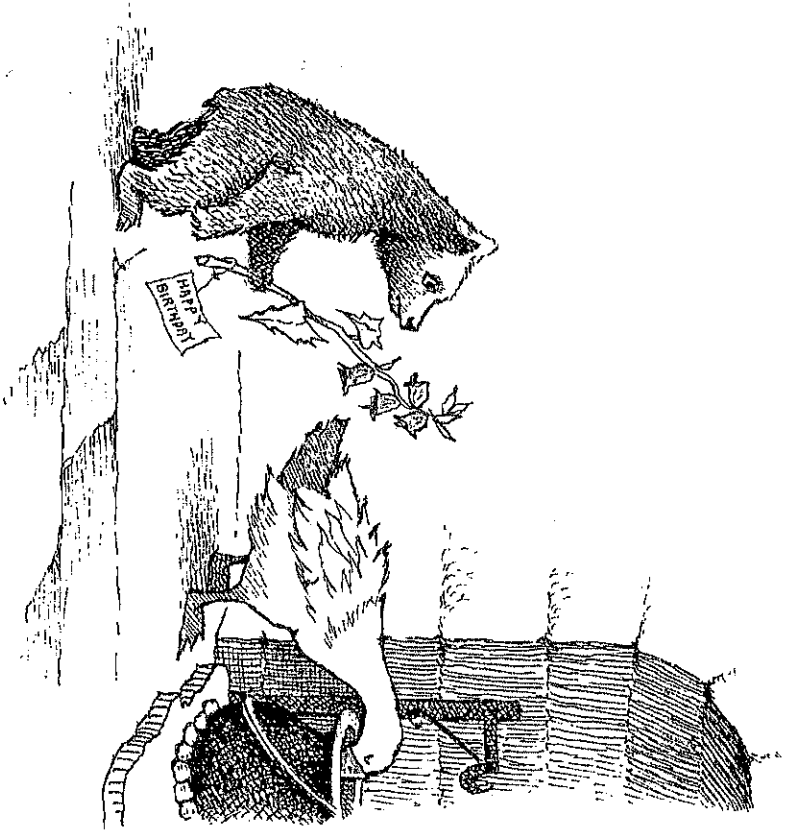




So Little Bear begins to make soup

And she sits down to wait.

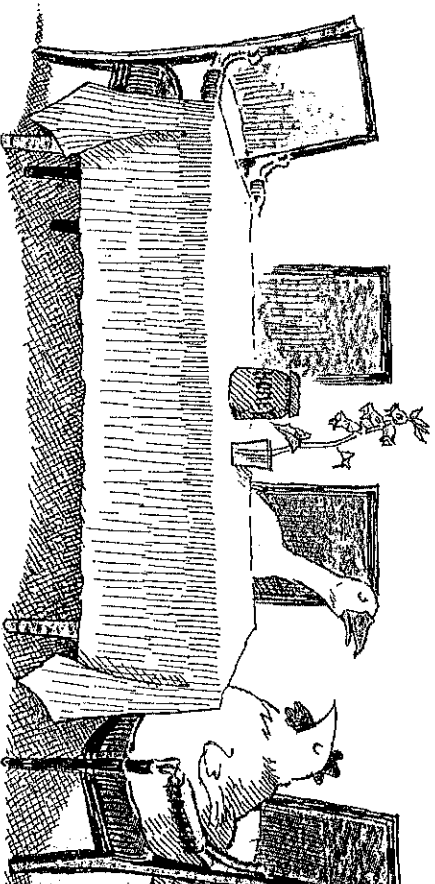


Next, Duck comes in.

Is it in the big black pot?”



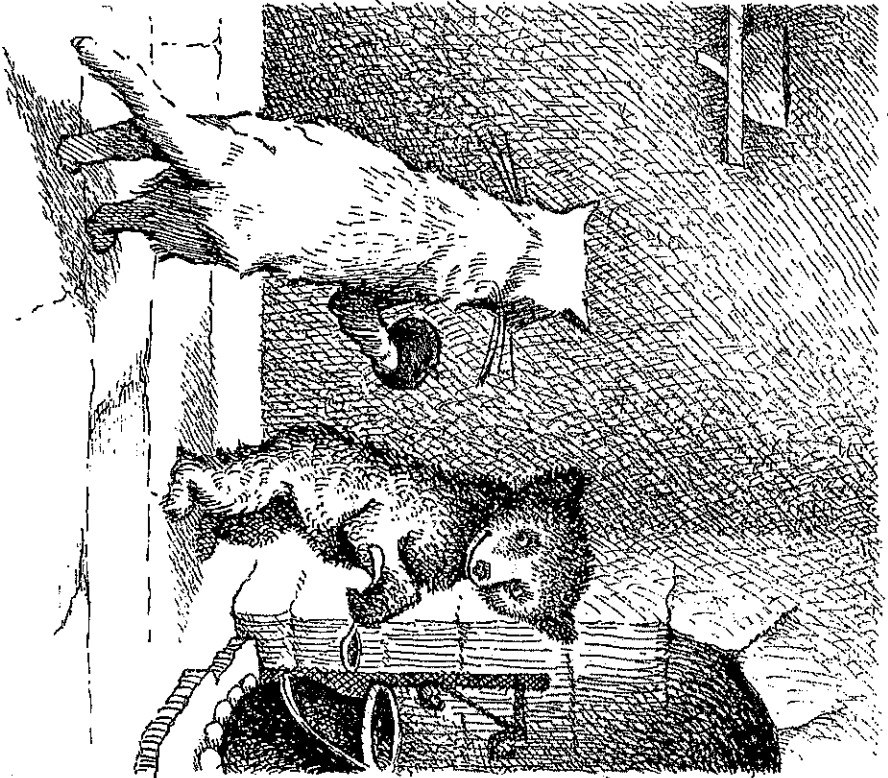
“Thank you, Duck,” says Little Bear.

I will eat it.”

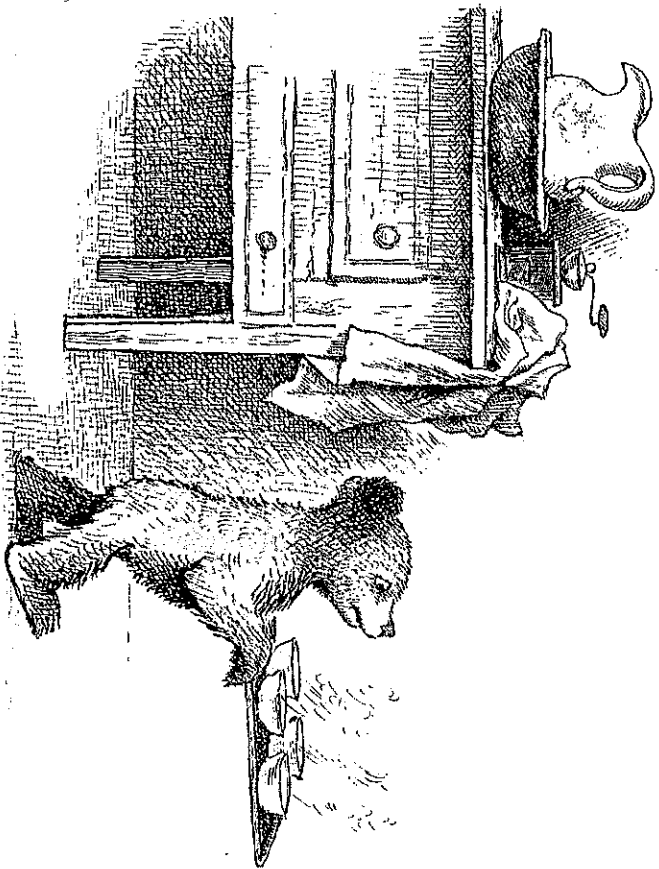
“Good,” says Little Bear.

so we must eat it now.

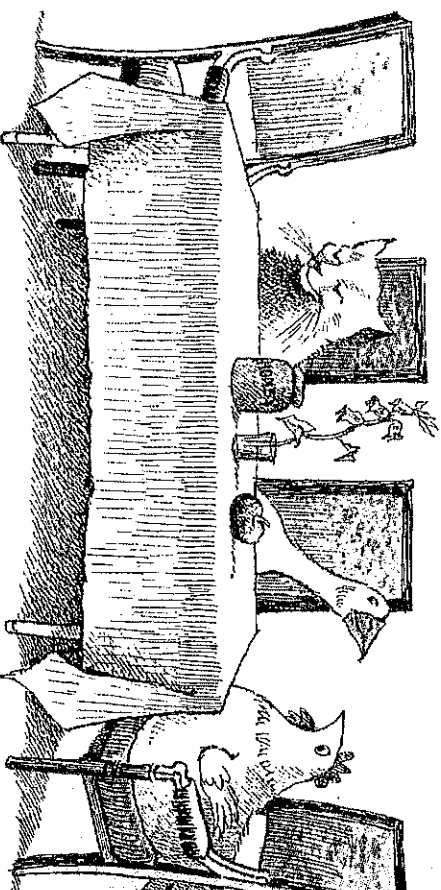
We cannot wait for Mother Bear.

I do not know where she is.



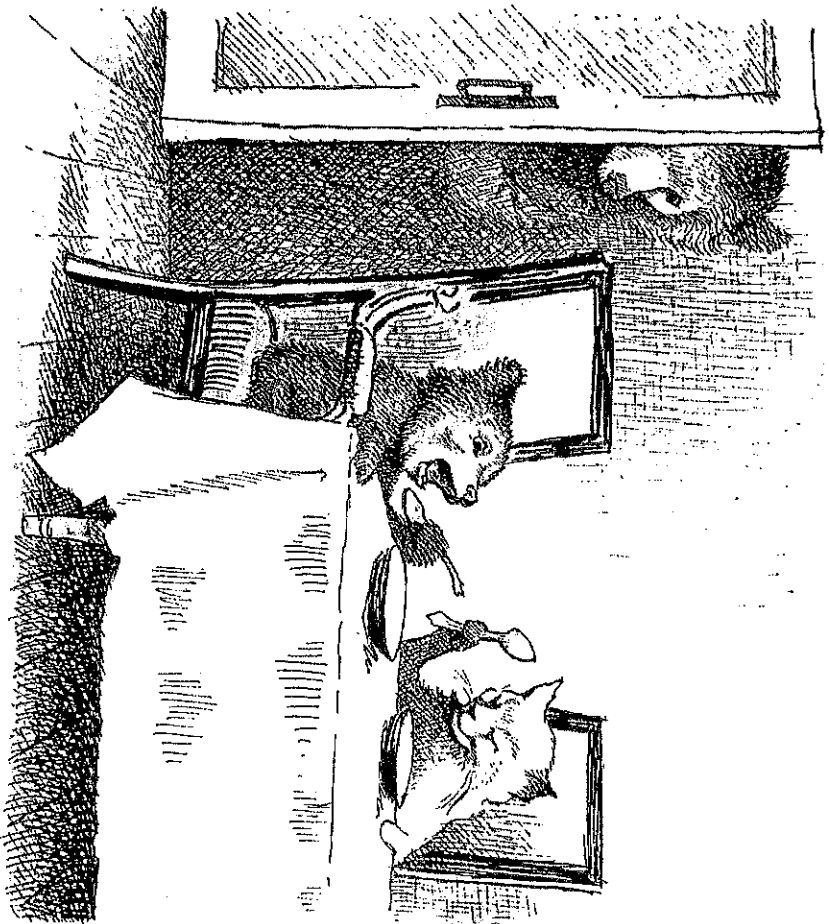
“Now, here is some soup for you, Hen,”

“And here is some soup for you, Duck,”

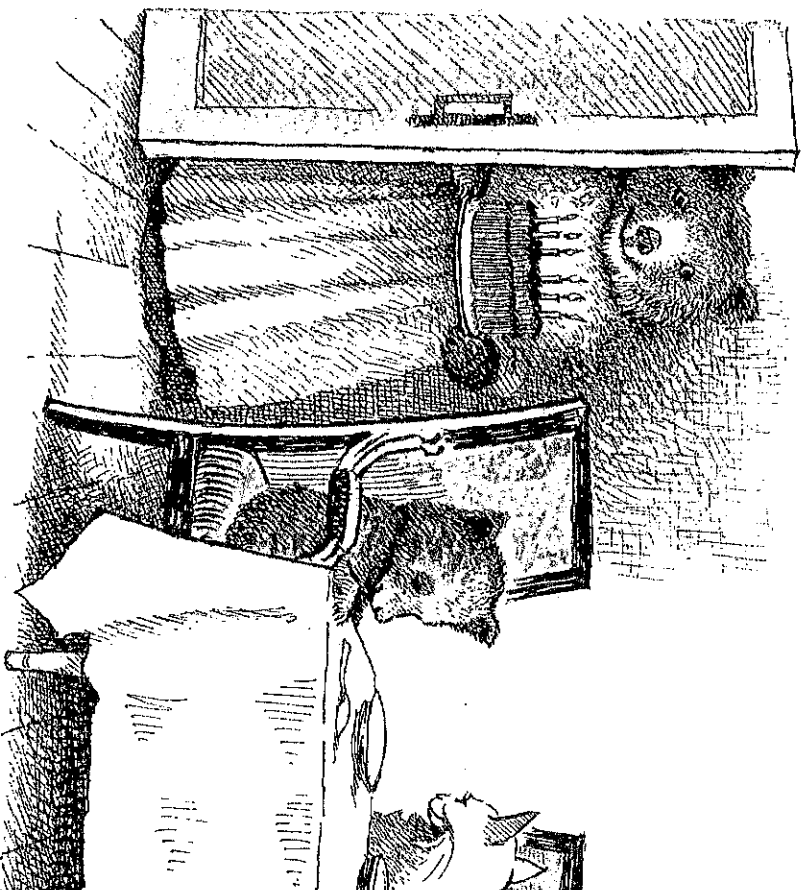


“and here is some soup for you, Cat,

Now we can all have some Birthday Soup.”

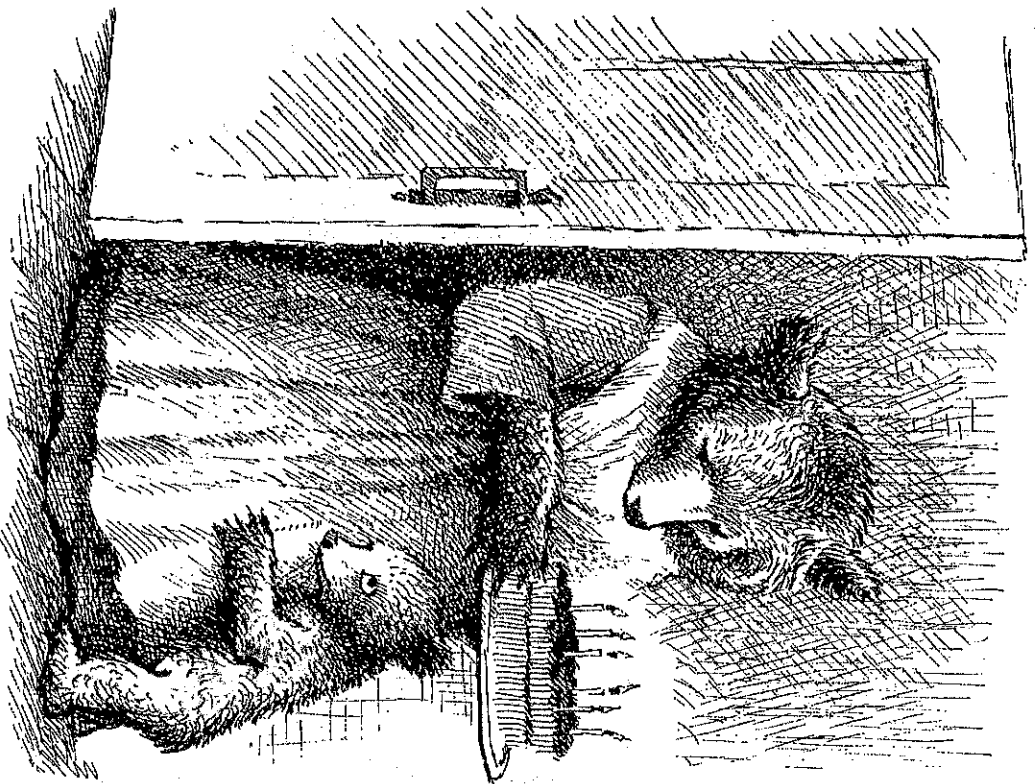


Cat sees Mother Bear at the door,

Anchors the plant and carries the water, minerals and food throughout the plant.

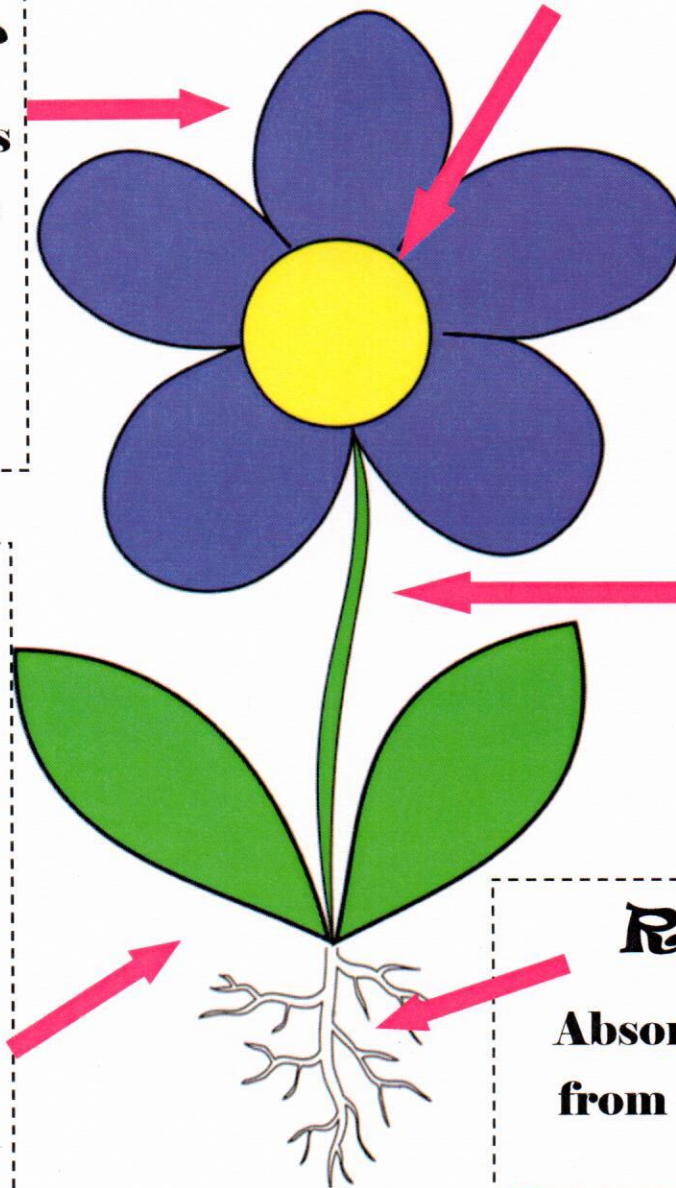
Stem

leaf

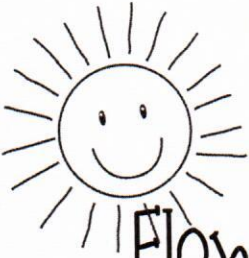
Roots

Absorb water from the soil.

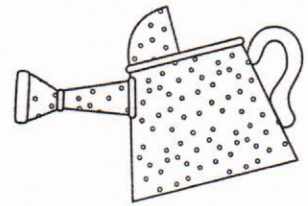


Parts of a Plant

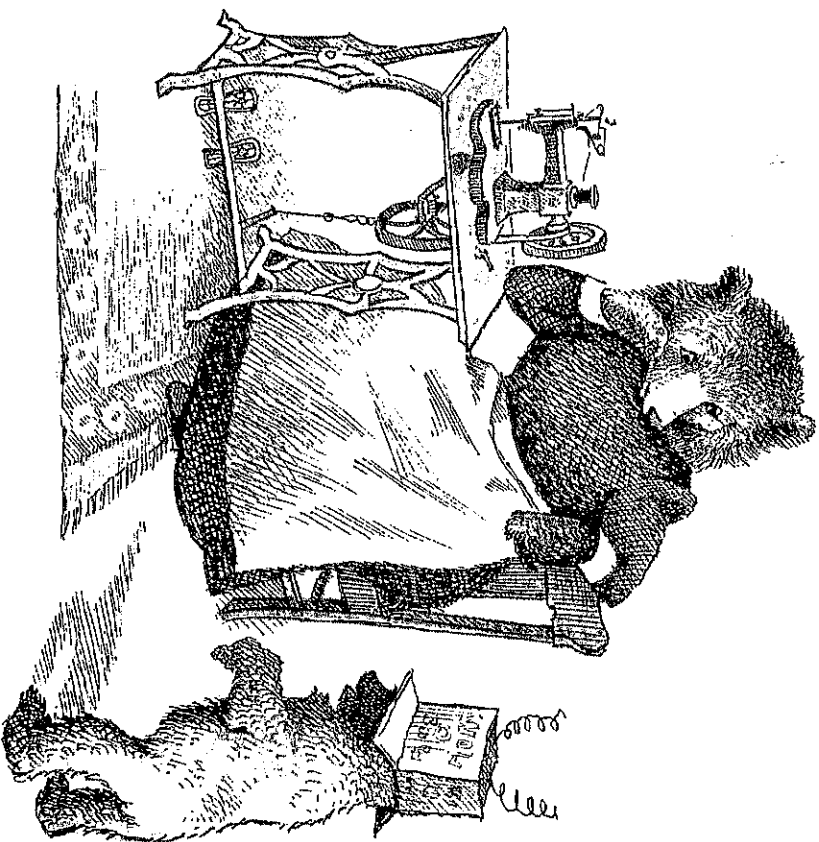

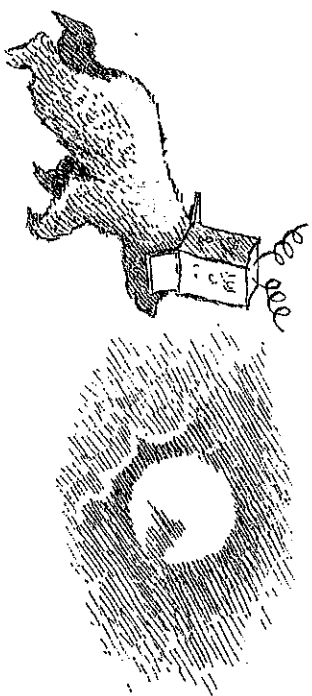
LITTLE BEAR GOES TO THE MOON

“Birds fly,” said Little Bear.

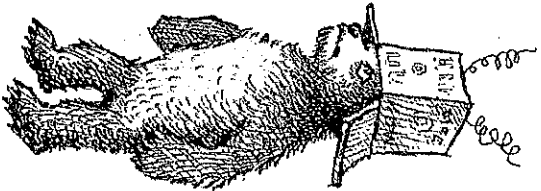
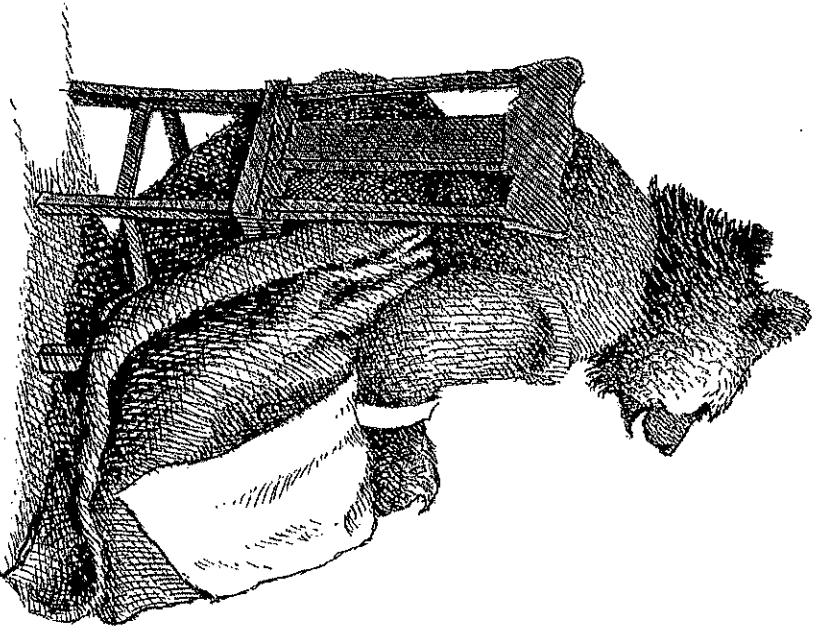
“Oh, yes,” said Mother Bear.

with no wings and no feathers.



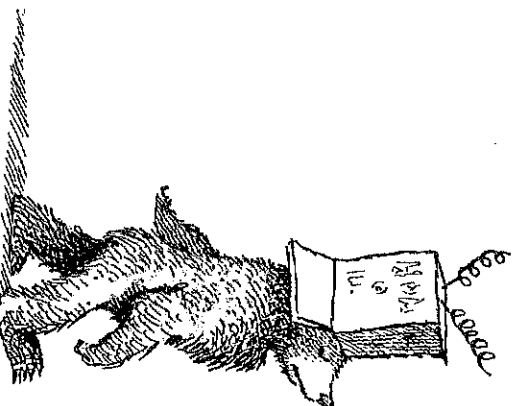
“Maybe if you jump up

so I will shut my eyes.

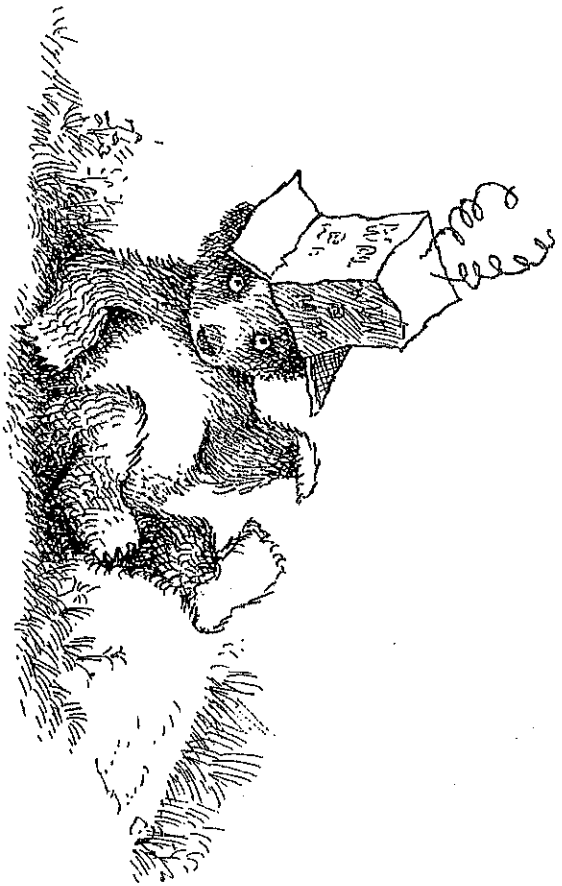


Little Bear climbed to the top of a little hill,

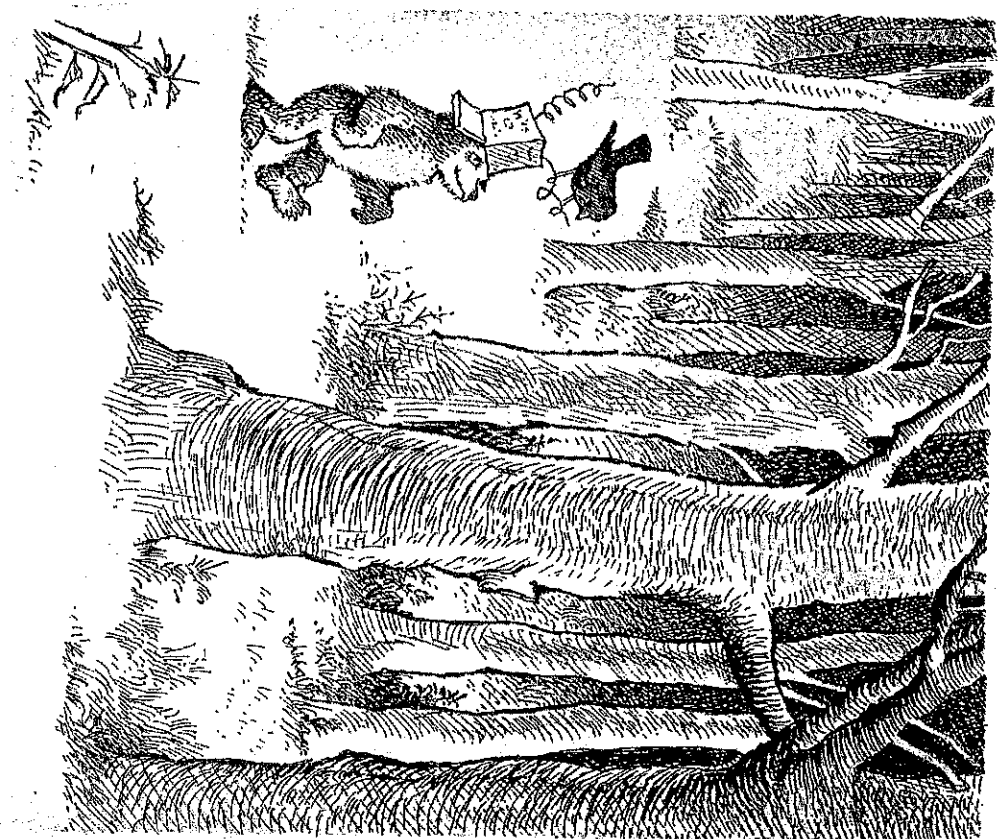
and climbed to the top of a little tree,

a very little tree on the little hill,

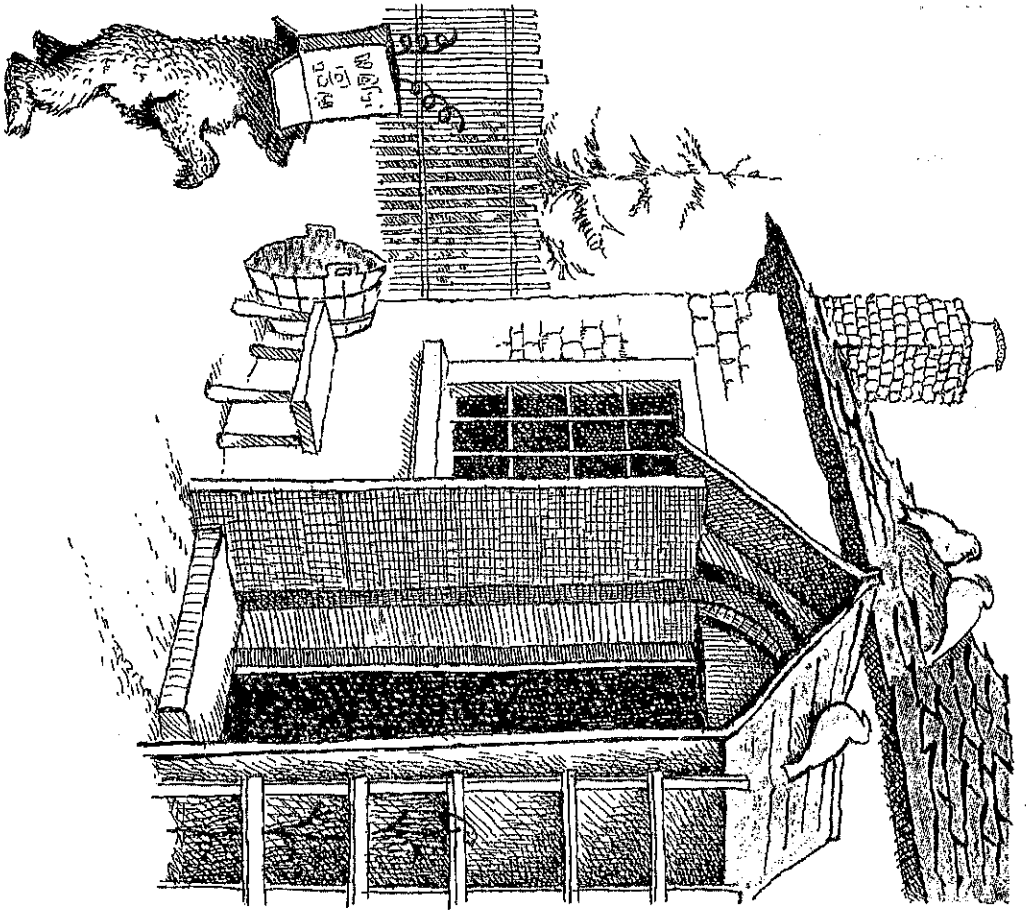
and shut his eyes and jumped.

“Here I am on the moon.



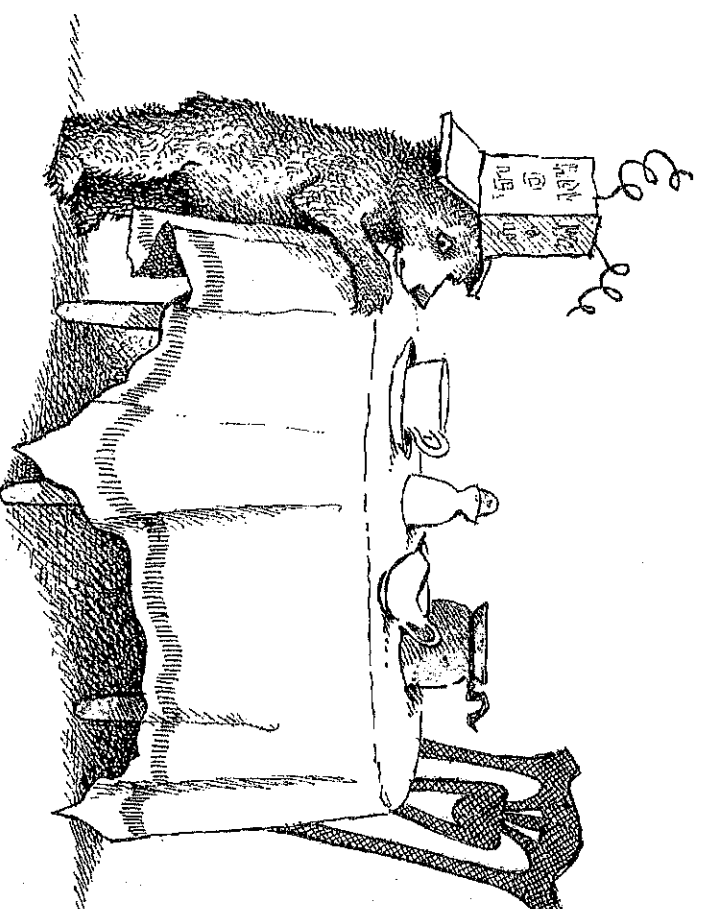
“The moon looks just like the earth.

“Here is a house that looks just like my house.

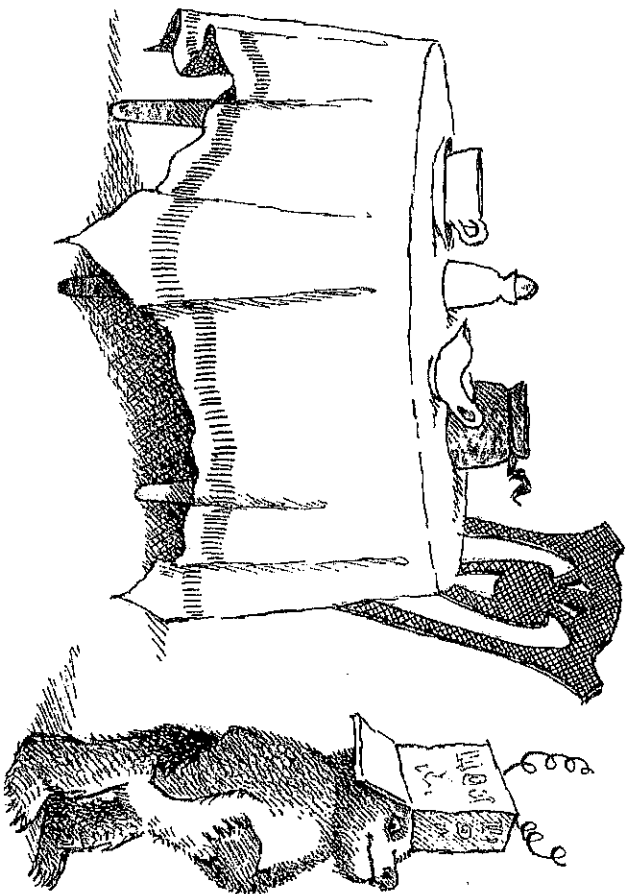
I’ll go in and see what kind of bears live here.

“But who is this?”

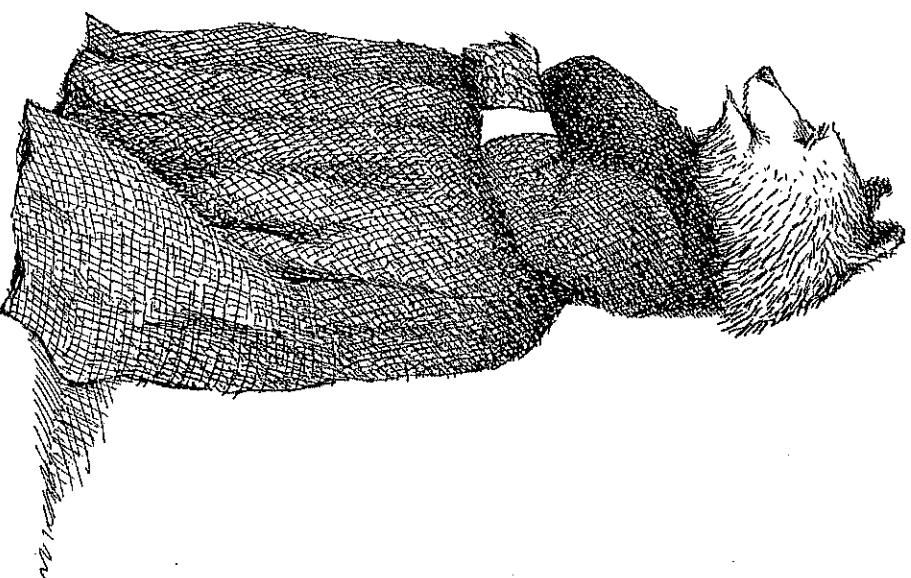
“Are you a bear from Earth?”

and flew here, just like the birds.”



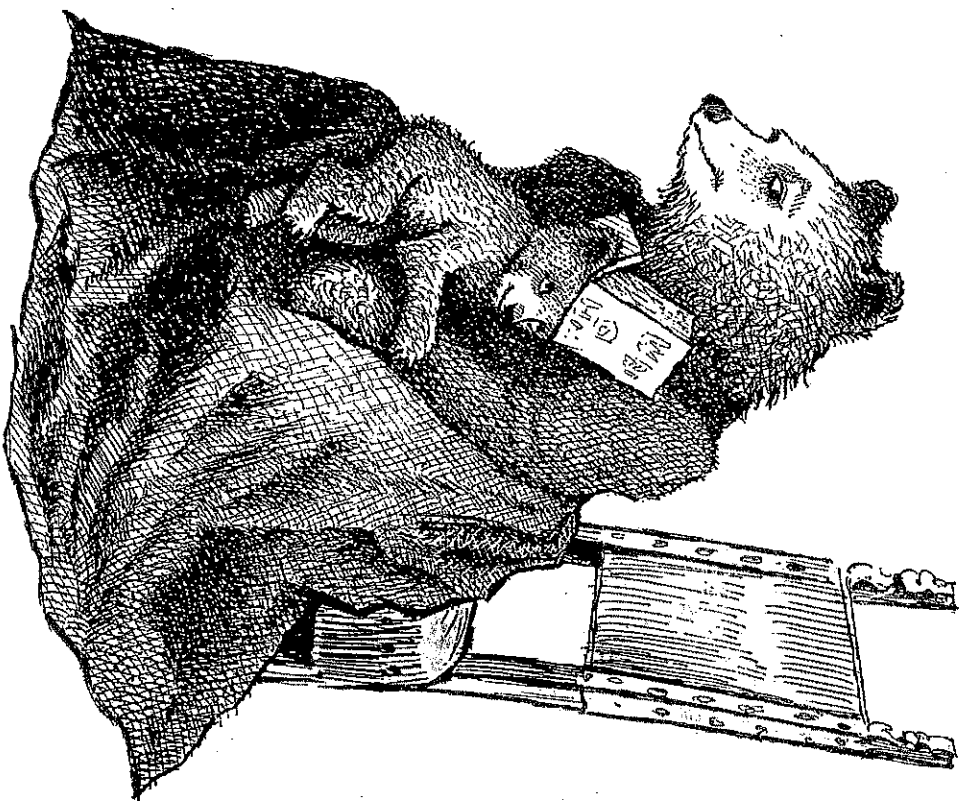
“Well,” said Mother Bear.

“My little bear did the same thing.

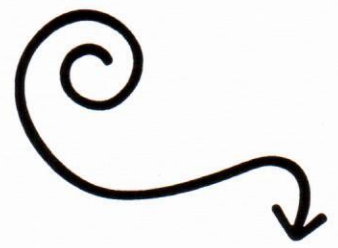
He put on his space helmet and flew to Earth

The Life Cycle of a **Plant**



A plant starts off as a simple **seed**. Some seeds are small and some seeds are big. This simple seed is placed into the ground and is given water, air, and sunlight. What comes next is simply magical!

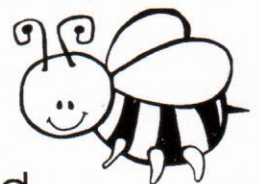
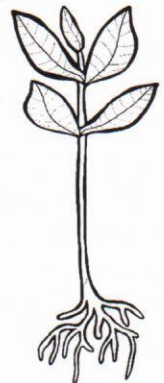
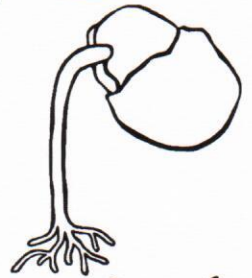
With the help of a little bit of water and sunlight, the seed starts to change. When a stem starts to grow from a seed, it is called **germination**.

The plant grows and grows. It forms **roots** and a **stem**. The roots will stay inside the ground and will help the plant eat and stay healthy. The stem will come out of the ground and will enjoy the water and sunlight. This stem will soon grow into a big healthy plant!

Next come the **leaves**. The plant is now getting bigger and will soon be filled with big beautiful leaves!

Once the plant gets nice and strong, it starts to grow **flowers**. Every plant has a special kind of flower. Some plants have big flowers and some plants have small flowers. They are all special in their own way!

The last step in the plant's life cycle is called **pollination**. When insects or birds eat food from a flower, they pick up pollen and transport it to another flower. This pollen then becomes a seed that will soon start the plant's life cycle all over again! Sometimes, pollen is transported by the wind.

“How?” said Little Bear.

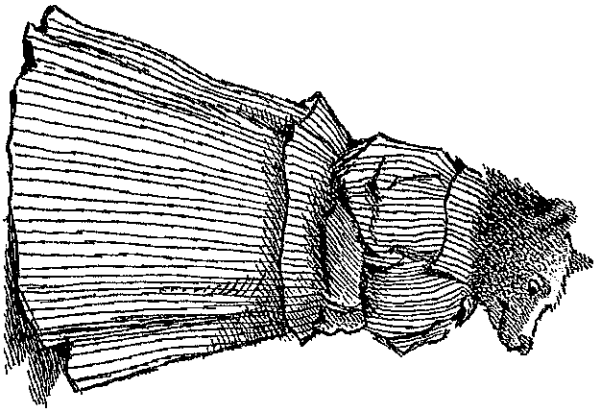
“You can go to sleep,”

“Well, then, I will,” said Little Bear.

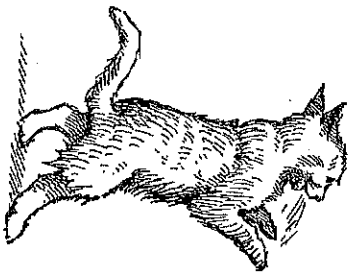


“Good night, Mother dear.”

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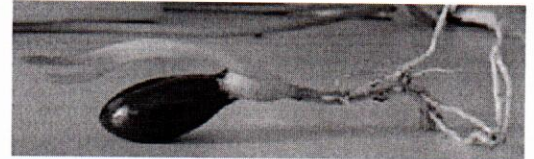

Shoots and Roots

Caption: In this picture you can see a dark seed that has sprouted. It has many roots already. The sprout has been laid sideways to take the picture. You can see roots on the right side of the picture. The shoot is growing towards the left.



Seeds can be small. Seeds can be big. Seeds can be long and skinny. Seeds can be short and fat. No matter what they look like, all seeds have some things in common. What do you know about seeds?

Seeds hold a secret inside! Inside every seed is a tiny new plant. Every seed has a tough outer seed coat. This keeps the seed from drying out. Food is stored inside seeds. The food is for the new baby plant until it can make its own food. The tough seed coat protects the seed. When the time is right, the seed will sprout. If it sprouts in a place that has everything it needs, a new plant will grow. Some seeds can wait many years before they sprout.

When a seed sprouts, a root begins to grow downward. A shoot begins to grow upward. Shoots grow toward the light. The shoot will be the plant's stem. Leaves will grow on the shoot. Plants need light to make food.

Roots grow down into the soil. Roots hold the plant firmly in the ground. Roots take up water from the soil. Roots take up nutrients from the soil, too. Some nutrients a plant needs from the soil are calcium and sulfur. A plant needs light, water, and nutrients to grow.
